

### WATER ACCESS SAFETY

Impact indicator, Outcome indicator

### **Indicator Phrasing**

English: % of girls and women stating that they feel safe when accessing water

French: % de filles et de femmes affirmant qu'elles se sentent en sécurité pendant qu'elles collectent

de l'eau

Spanish: % de niñas y mujeres que declaran sentirse seguras cuando van a recoger agua

Portuguese: % de raparigas e mulheres que se sentem seguras quando acedem à água

Czech: % dívek a žen, které se při cestě pro vodu necítí v ohrožení

### What is its purpose?

Gender-based violence is one of the factors decreasing women's (and households' in general) access to water. The indicator therefore assesses the proportion of women and girls who feel safe when going to collect water.

## How to Collect and Analyse the Required Data

Collect the following data by conducting individual interviews with a <u>representative sample</u> of girls and women:

#### RECOMMENDED SURVEY QUESTIONS (Q) AND POSSIBLE ANSWERS (A)

**Q1**: When you go to collect water, to what extent do you feel safe from any types of violence? Would you say that you feel very safe, quite safe or that you do not feel safe?

#### **A1**:

- 1) feels very safe
- 2) feels quite safe
- 3) does not feel safe
- 4) don't know / no response

To calculate the indicator's value, divide the number of respondents who respond "very safe" or

"quite safe" by the total number of respondents (exclude those who do not know or do not respond). Multiply the result by 100 to convert it to a percentage.

## Disaggregate by

<u>Disaggregate</u> the data by age groups (girls / adult women) and geographical location.

## **Important Comments**

1) Consider adding further questions assessing details about why, when, and where some respondents do not feel safe.
